Dear Parents and Carers,

On Wednesday, we celebrated the start of the new school year together as a school community by having a special collective worship service in St Aldhelm's Church.

Will Spracklen, licensed lay minister at the church led the service with thoughtful readings, prayers and the children sang a beautiful rendition of the hymn, 'This Little Light of Mine'. The school community gave thanks for the start of a new academic year and to celebrate God's love.

This month the children have begun to learn about how to keep themselves safe online as part of our PSHE and Computing curriculum. But how can you continue to ensure that your child is safe online when they are at home?

We strongly recommend that parents install parental controls on all devices used at home. Parental controls allow you to block and filter upsetting or inappropriate content. They work across your WiFi, phone network, individual apps and devices.

Parental controls can help you to:

- plan what time of day your child can go online and how long for
- create content filters to block apps that may have inappropriate content
- manage the content different family members can see.

All you need is your National Insurance number.

If you are eligible, you will then have access to the following:

£100 to help towards school uniform, school trips, music lessons.

#### **Preschool News**

The children in Preschool have been incredibly busy this week learning about their bodies. The Caterpillar Class have explored mark making in the outside area using water, paintbrushes and their hands. They explored their faces using a mirror as a visual to remind them of the features they have, as well as reminding them of how many eyes, ears and mouths are on their face.

They then drew around a friend on a large piece of paper and took it in turns to label the body parts. Finally, they extended the activity by using their hands and feet, to paint the large piece of paper!

We explored Rainbow Rice and the sounds it makes when we sprinkle it on to different surfaces such as a table, a plastic tray and metal trays.

On Monday we reintroduced our Fiddly Fingers sessions. We are incredibly proud of the children and their enthusiasm for the Fiddly Fingers circuit.
