Reception Class News

This week in Reception class we have been working on teamwork and collaboration. The children have been working together to build, create and explore. They have also been trying hard to keep our learning environment clean and tidy – showing themselves to be very responsible! The children have taken part in a wide variety of mark making activities this week but painting their hands to make handprints was definitely the most popular.











Year 3 News

Year 3 have been learning about why the Stone Age is called the Stone Age! We were so lucky to have the opportunity to handle <u>real Stone Age</u> artefacts and tools, borrowed from the Museum of East Dorset in Wimborne. We noticed how the tools became more refined over the three periods of the Stone Age. Large hand axes became sharper with smoother surfaces. Spear and arrow heads became smaller and sharper. We handled flint scrapers that had been knapped from larger stones, as well as items that may have been used as spiritual or decorative items.

The amazing thing about the Stone Age people is that they could do so much without any electricity or technology. However, we only have artefacts to give us clues about how they lived, as nothing was written down - that is why it is called "Prehistoric"!

In Literacy, we will be continuing with our daily phonics lessons and learning the letter sounds u,f,e and l. The letter sounds we have learnt so far and will continue to recap are: m, a, s, d, t, i, n, p, g, o, c, k and b.	In Literacy, we will be starting our new text: Astro Girl by Ken Wilson- Max.	In Literacy, we will use our inference skills to consider how the Bear is feeling in the story.	In Literacy, we will be planning and writing our own "suspense" story, based on our text "Black Dog".	In Literacy, we will be exploring the text of The Mermaid of Zennor further by writing letters and retelling the story.				
In Numeracy, we will be exploring and creating simple patterns, including going on a 'pattern walk' around the school grounds to look for different shapes and patterns.	In Numeracy, we are learning to write and understand addition number equations to 10.	In Numeracy, we will use our number bond knowledge to work out bonds to 100.	In Numeracy, we will continue adding 2- and 3-digit numbers using a formal written method. We will focus on exchanging 10 ones for 1 ten.	In Numeracy, we are learning to subtract two numbers up to 1,000 mentally and using column subtraction.				
Through our topic 'Me and My Community' we will be thinking about people in our community who help us. If any parents work in 'helping' roles and would be happy to come and speak to the children about their job please speak to Mrs Bell.	In Computing, we are learning to use a keyboard to type into a program (paintz.app).	In Science, we will begin looking at different types of materials and what they are used for.	In History, we will learn what life was like in the Paleolithic and Mesolithic Eras (Old and Middle Stone Ages).	In Science, we will begin our new unit of States of Matter: solids, liquids and gases.
